

## Hunting & Fishing

### *Blackhawk Creek Wildlife Area*

24433 S Avenue • near Morrison

This is a 53-acre area containing native grass seedings, tree and shrub plantings, and wildlife food plots. The woodland trail has had extensive spring wildflower plantings and is a lovely area to walk in late April and May. Many different tree species are labeled to aid in identification.

### *Buckles Wildlife Area*

25005 T Avenue • between Morrison and Reinbeck

This 27-acre area provides fishing in the Black Hawk Creek and hunting.

### *Reinbeck Section of County Greenbelt*

99 N Greenbelt Road • near Reinbeck

The Black Hawk Creek winds its way through this 67-acre area and provides fishing and hunting.

### *Wolf Creek Recreation Area*

33999 M Avenue • (Go east from Beaman on 330th St., then turn south on M Ave.)

Approximately 70 acres of this park are open to hunting and the Wolf Creek that meanders through the area provides fishing.

### *Holland Marsh Wildlife Area*

20731 205th Street • Holland

This 50-acre area contains two restored wetlands, native grass areas, tree and shrub plantings, and wildlife food plots.



## Hunting & Fishing

The Grundy County Conservation Board manages several areas for public hunting. These areas are restricted hunting, which means that hunting is restricted to certain species of game. Bow hunting for whitetail deer is allowed by permit only. Likewise, those areas open to trapping of furbearers are by permit only. ## recreation

### *Stoehr's Fishing Area*

21300 H Avenue • Grundy Center

(5 miles west and 3 miles north of Grundy Center)

On this 5-acre area you will find two spring-fed fishing ponds that are about one acre in size each. Facilities here include a shelter house with electricity, picnic tables, pit style toilet, and a fishing pier. All are handicapped accessible. Grills are available for cooking out. This area allows overnight camping. Fish species stocked in the ponds include channel catfish, large mouth bass, and bluegills. There is a 16-inch length limit in place on the large mouth bass.

### *J.H. Roadman Memorial Park*

28403 160th Street • Dike

(Located along old Hwy 20, 1.5 miles west of Dike)

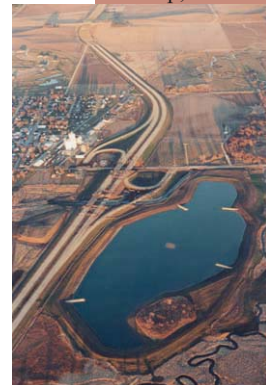
Facilities at this 10-acre park include handicapped accessible restrooms, water, picnic tables, grills, playground equipment, and a shelter house with electricity. The well-maintained grounds include two small ponds, which can be used for fishing. The trails include a self-guided interpretive trail with brochures available in the shelter house, and another walking trail. Each trail goes around its own pond. These trails provide a pleasant way to stretch your legs after traveling any distance. Overnight camping is allowed.

### *Grundy County Lake*

16855 U Avenue • Dike

This 40-acre lake has picnic tables, toilets, a concrete boat ramp, and a fishing pier. All are handicapped accessible. Grills are available for cooking out.

This area is presently day use only but overnight camping is planned with the development of a modern 64-site campground. Fish species stocked in the ponds include channel catfish, large mouth bass, walleye, crappie, and bluegills. There is a 15-inch length limit in place on the large mouth bass. A large portion of this area is also open to hunting. This area contains a restored wetland, native grass areas, tree and shrub plantings, and wildlife food plots.



## Parks & Camping

### Wolf Creek Recreation Area

33399 M Avenue

(Go east from Beaman on 330th Street, then turn south on M Ave.)

This 93-acre multi-purpose recreation area is the largest and most developed in the county.



It provides picnicking, camping, hiking, hunting for rabbits and pheasants, and fishing in Wolf Creek. Facilities are available for trailer camping (with electricity hook-ups), tent camping, playground equipment, a shelter house with electricity, water, picnic tables, grills, numer-

ous trails that meander through wooded areas, a self-interpreting nature trail, and grassland/wetland areas. The Comet Trail, a trail connecting the park with the towns of Beaman, Conrad, and soon Gladbrook, runs through the park and includes a suspension bridge over Wolf Creek.

Camping fees: \$6 per night per unit for those camping in a designated camp site with electricity available; \$3 for any other site (including the primitive area).



## recreation

### Herbert Gutknecht Park

29851 Diagonal Road

(Located between Morrison and Reinbeck at the junction of State Hwy 175 and County Road T55.)

Camping: There are 5 designated campsites, with no charge for overnight camping. There is also hand-pumped running water, picnic tables, and a shelter. The restroom is a pit type with handicapped accessibility. Adjoining the edge of the park is the Pioneer Trail. This park is an excellent stop when traveling, and a perfect place to view the fireworks from the nearby town of Reinbeck on the Fourth of July.

## Parks & Camping

### Grundy County Lake

16855 U Avenue • Dike

This 225-acre multi-purpose recreation area is the largest and newest in the county park system. It provides picnicking, camping, hiking, hunting, and fishing. Facilities available are picnic tables, grills, grass trails that meander through grassland and wetland areas and, being constructed in 2006, an asphalt bicycle/hiking trail around the lake!
